Matthew won all three singles matches in his pool and one in the main draw, getting to the last 16 of the tournament. Matthew is currently ranked 12<sup>th</sup> in the country. A terrific achievement – well done Matthew.
3. Well done also to Izzy Sivam, ably supported by her brother William. Over the course of the summer months, Izzy has been baking cakes and has had a cake and sweet stall at the end of her garden, which is on the Bissoe trail. People passing by can take some food and drop some money into the honesty box there. Since the start of the summer, Izzy has raised £4,500 doing this – all of which will go towards the school's Uganda appeal. An amazing achievement – well done Izzy!

## GCSE Results Day: Class of 2019 Celebrate Excellent Results!

**T**hursday 22nd August saw our class of 2019 collect their GCSE Results. Particular highlights for this year's results are:

- 83% of students gained 5 or more GCSE passes (equivalent to the old A\*-C)
- Over a fifth of students gained 5 or more grades 9-7 (equivalent to the old A/A\*)
- 19 students gained 9 or more 9-7 grades
- 73% of students gained a pass in both English and Maths

Our highest achiever, Amelie Harris-Lovett, was awarded 11 GCSE or equivalents including 9 qualifications at the highest grades possible, Jenna Dymond achieved 5 9s, 1 D\*, 2 8s and a 7 and Katie Edwards gained 6 9s, 2 8s and a 7! Amber, Summer, Lucy, Emily and Matilda also did outstandingly well.



Ben Evans walked away with 10 excellent GCSE which included 6 at grade 9 & 2 at grade 8, with Robin Howard, George Wiltshire, Max Hudson & Pat Van Hoorn not far

behind him with 4 or 5 9s and a handful of 8s each, along with Jack, Finlay and Taryn who all also excelled and leave secondary school with 9 or more 9-7 grade

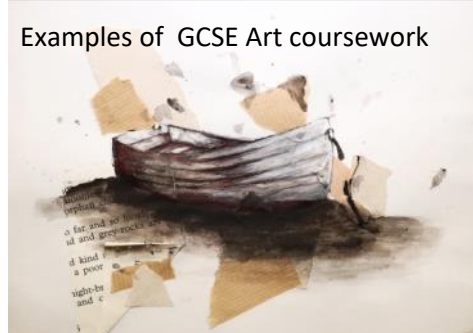

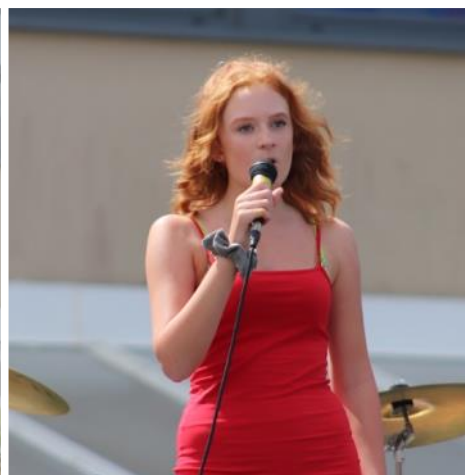
## Landers Got Talent: The Final and Summer Fun in the Sun!

They were watched by over 1000





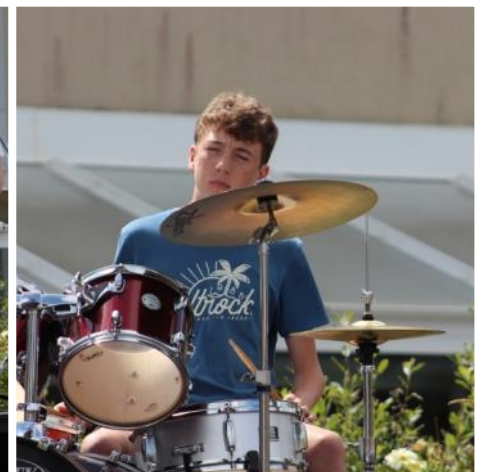
students and staff, supported by an able back stage and sound engineering crew and it's fair to say that they impressed us beyond our high expectations!

## Welcome back from the Music Department!

**R**ichard Lander School boasts a wide range of musical ensembles; five different vocal groups and choirs; a range of instrumental ensembles including numerous student-led rock bands, orchestra, jazz band, brass band group, recorder ensemble and string ensemble; and world music groups .

Students who participate in these clubs have the opportunity to

perform not just at school but at other venues including The Hall for Cornwall, Truro Cathedral and The Cornwall Music Festival to name a few.

These clubs are only successful because of the dedicated students who give up their lunchtimes to attend the practices. There is participation from a range of students, including students who enjoy music simply because it is great fun! Some students receive either vocal or instrumental lessons, in or outside of school, but it is not mandatory for your child

to learn an instrument to join in any of the Music ECAs. All clubs are open to students in any year group, apart from Year 7 choir, which is for Year 7 students only.

Please note that if your child is currently receiving Free School Meals, if one of their guardians is currently in the armed forces, or is currently in care, they are eligible for a £5 discount on music lessons.

## WELL DONE MATTHEW!

Well done to Matthew Upton, who competed in the Wimbledon National 14 & Under Challenge Finals this summer!

After triumphing at the previous County Finals, Matthew took to Wimbledon's famous grass courts looking to be crowned national champion.

And while unable to better two-time Wimbledon champion Andy Murray in getting his hands on a title at SW19, this has only fuelled his desire to come back to the iconic venue again to play one day.

"It's really nice to play on the Wimbledon courts and get the experience," Matthew said.

"This whole event will be something I remember forever. I'd love to become a pro and come back here too."

"Winning at Wimbledon is lovely, it's relaxing and in great surroundings."

The *Road to Wimbledon* began in 2002 and has continued to expand, initially to India in 2014 before heading to China, Hong Kong and, most recently, Japan.



More than 7000 juniors participate across England, Scotland and Wales, starting in club, park or school events before qualifying for the County finals and then to National Finals at Wimbledon.

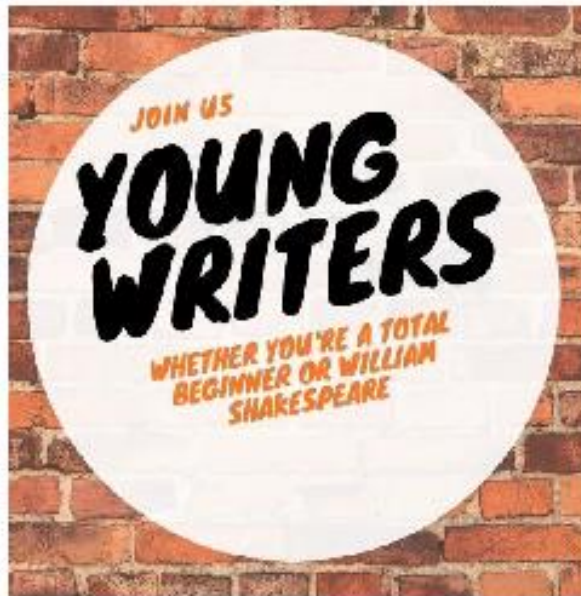

**What is it?**
