

Dear Parents & Carers,

Well done to all our students who have made it through the first half term positively and smiling :)

In today's bulletin, I am writing to announce a major new initiative we are putting in place to link our rewards system with our whole school ecology and sustainability drive.

As parents are aware, we email home the number of merits your children earn each week so that you are able to have positive and encouraging conversations with your children about school.

We try to incentivise the importance of merits with the student body by attaching a nominal value to each merit earned. In previous years, a certain amount of merits could be exchanged for educational equipment, money off Prom tickets and a range of other incentives. Additionally, students could donate the value of their merits towards a charity and most students chose this option, which generally resulted in charity donations of well over a thousand pounds each year.

For the current academic year, we have decided to link our merit system with our ecology / sustainability drive. For every 50 merits which students earn, a eucalyptus tree will be planted at our sister school in Uganda. We anticipate over 300,000 merits will be earned across the year and this will fund the planting of 6,000 eucalyptus trees. This provides a real incentive for students to work hard to earn merits and to feel really proud of the amount of trees they can personally contribute towards planting.

This strategy will also further convey to students, the importance of living more sustainable lives and how we can use our influence to affect positive change for our planet.

Please do encourage your own children to keep earning merits which will help keep planting trees!

We will update you on the grand total of funds raised after half term.


















YEAR 7 LEARNING ABOUT CELLS

The International Baccalaureate Diploma programme is a two-year course offered at Truro College which students may consider as an excellent alternative to A Levels. The IB is not just for an academic 'elite' however; we have students who have a range of GCSE profiles but who all enjoy the breadth of study and flexibility which the IB can offer.

The International Baccalaureate diploma is an internationally recognised university entry qualification which is offered in more than 140 countries throughout the world. It is fully recognised by all UK universities. There is an increasing number of providers in Great Britain and Truro College is the only provider to offer this programme in Cornwall. The IB programme at Truro College is one of the biggest and most successful in the UK.


COVID – Ventilation in Classrooms

As the weather is getting cooler, the temperature in the school is also reducing and in some areas of the school where all the windows in a classroom are opened to increase the ventilation this is causing some discomfort to both staff and students.

We have sought advice from the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) and the Chartered Institution for Building Services Engineers (CISBE) to ensure that our advice to staff minimises the risks of airborne transmission of COVID.

In the colder, winter months we have directed staff that not ALL of the windows in their classroom need to be open all the time. They have been asked to open all the windows during the lesson change overs between bubbles to allow fresh air to blow through the room, but have been asked to close the majority of windows (leaving just one or two open) when there is a class in the room. This will maintain some fresh air circulation in the room.

We are allowing the wearing of coats and school hoodies in classrooms during lessons if the temperature is uncomfortable. Along with all of the other mitigations which we have put in place; cleaning of the desks between classes, frequent hand sanitising, mask wearing in communal areas, seating plans in the classrooms and 2m distancing from members of staff, these methods of maintaining ventilation, air movement and fresh air in the room will reduce the risks of airborne transmission of COVID.


