RLS ICELAND 2019

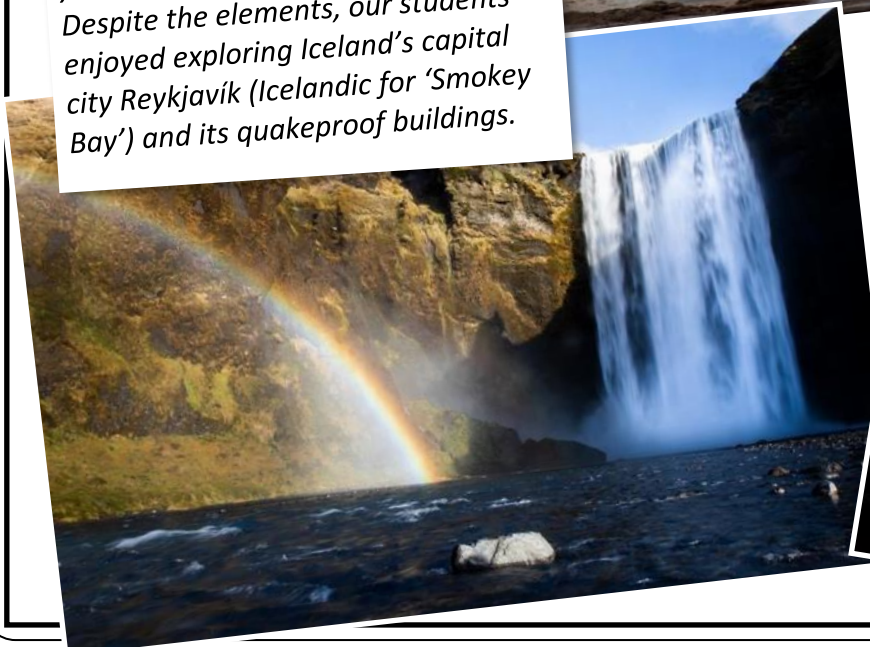
Mr Williams has been posting some super photos and videos from the Iceland trip on the school Facebook page this week! Here a some of them in case you missed out..

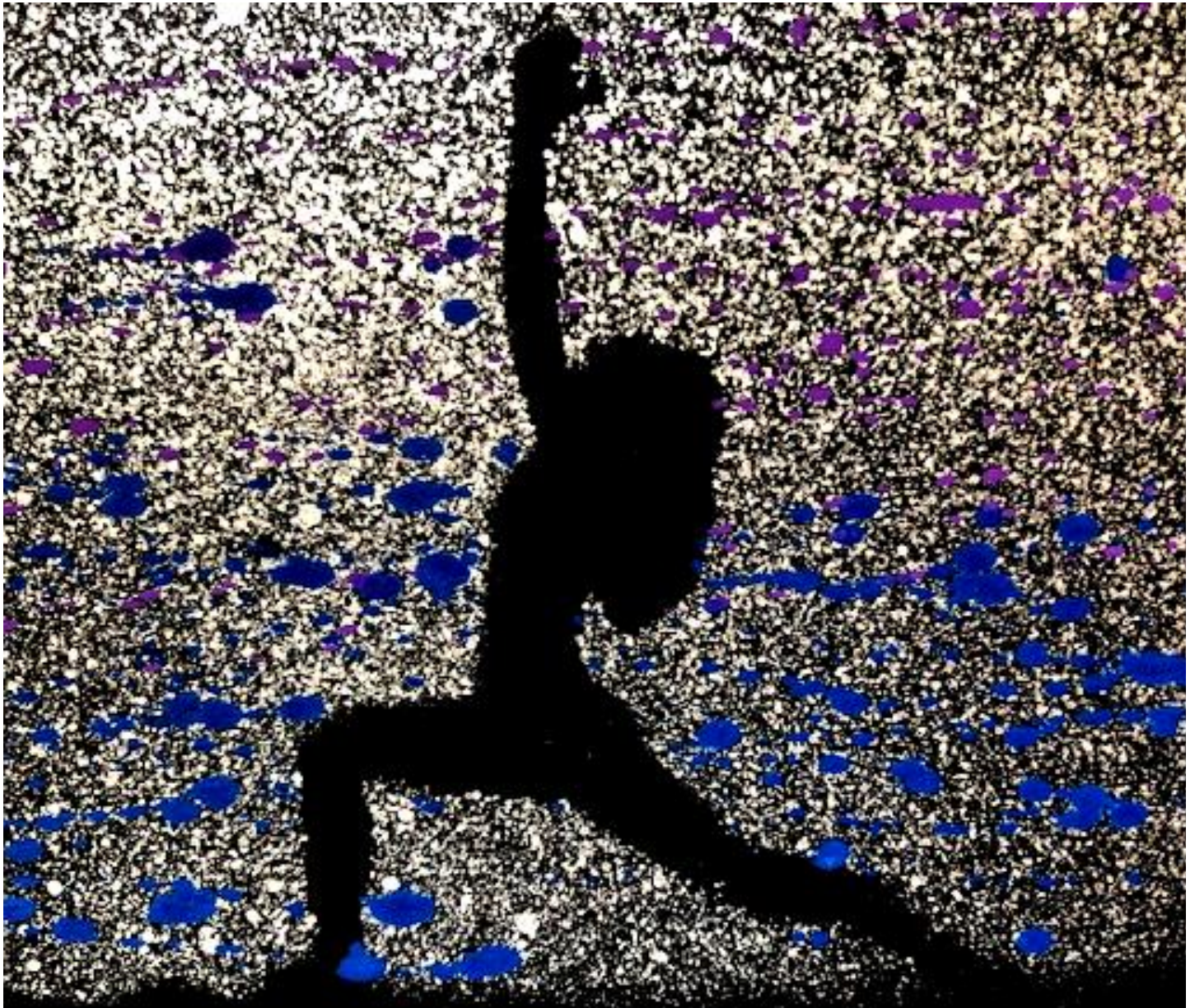

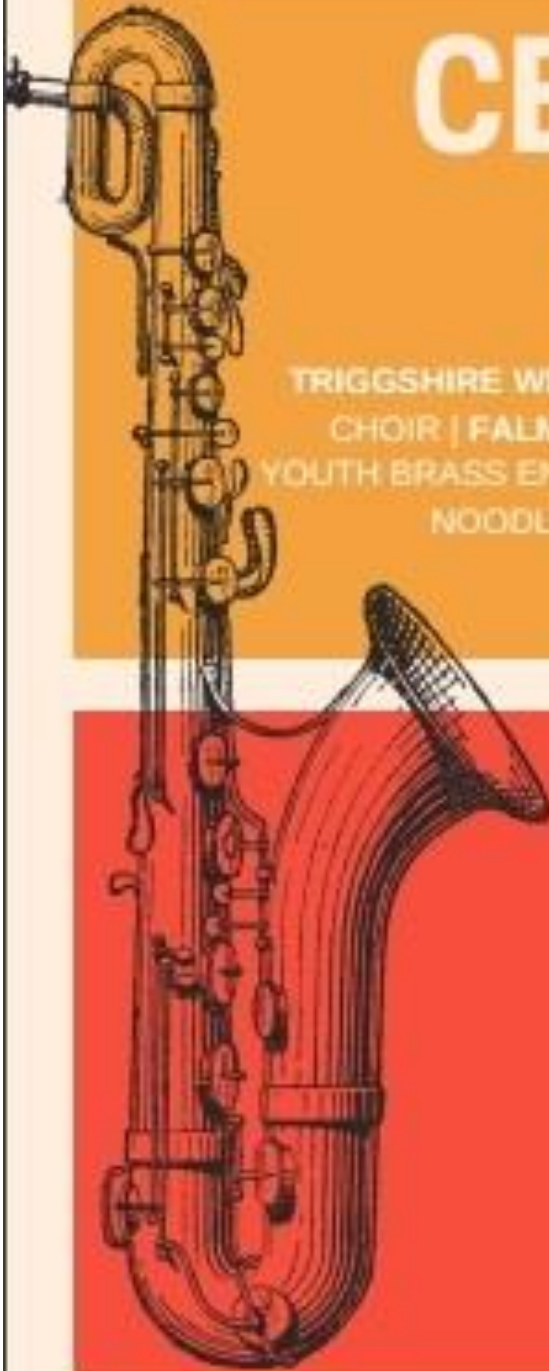
