On Day 2, our instrumental ensembles took to the stage, Richard Lander **Recorder Ensemble** and three of our school rock bands: Catalyst, Minority and The Y9 Rock Band all competed in the instrumental heats for their age groups and all played amazingly. I was so proud to hear some of our youngest players performing with

the recorder ensemble, their tone, timing and communication with an audience is steadily improving all the time. The **Y9 Rock Band** used piano, guitar, drums and vocals and certainly did themselves justice gaining 4th place overall in the competition. It was an afternoon of fantastic music making from all schools involved. The adjudicator commented on how good it was to have such a wide range of styles in one class!

On Day 3, Wednesday 20th March, Richard Lander took 4 choirs to the music festival to compete in the 11-16 year old choral class. **Junior Choir** were the youngest choir by far in the heat. With many valiant year 7 soloists, Miss Foxon led them brilliantly as they sang 'A Million Dreams' and 'Your Song'. Our **boys choir**, who placed 4th, started with the catchy 'Africa' with drum and guitar accompaniment from Sennen and Reuven. 'Down Among the Dead Men' was a bold,

unaccompanied performance which allowed these young men to showcase their talents and was a particular favourite of the adjudicators! **Selected Voices**, who placed 3rd overall, were conducted by Y10 students Dylan and Anna and the adjudicator commented on their precision, harmonising and commitment. Their programme was beautiful and fully chosen by the students; pop classic 'One Last Time' followed by the beautiful 'Seal Lullaby' by Eric Whitacre. And.... Our **Senior Choir**... (who rehearse every Monday lunch time so make sure you come and join in!!!) **WON!** Winning against various other schools from the county, the adjudicator commented on their use of phrasing, dynamics and emotion. School recorder group performed against many other schools in an instrumental class and then they also took part in the Recorder Ensemble class on Wednesday. They gained a 3rd place in the Ensemble class with the adjudicator commenting on their good communication. Wednesday evening saw a marathon of recorder duets and trios – we didn't finish till 10pm! All the students played to the best of their abilities and showed off the versatile repertoire that recorder players have available to them. In

**M**r Warner kept us folks back home up to date with all the fun of the RLS Paris trip last week! Here are some of his posts in case you missed out..

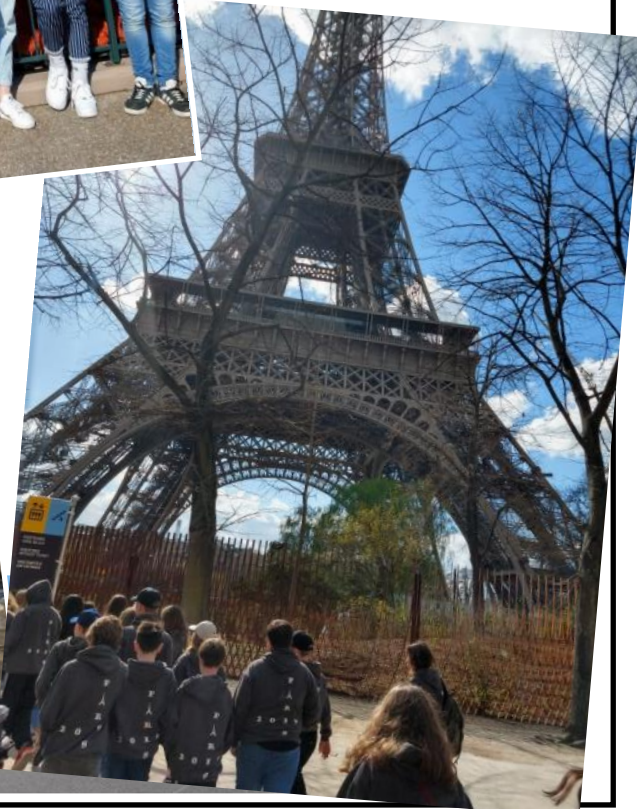
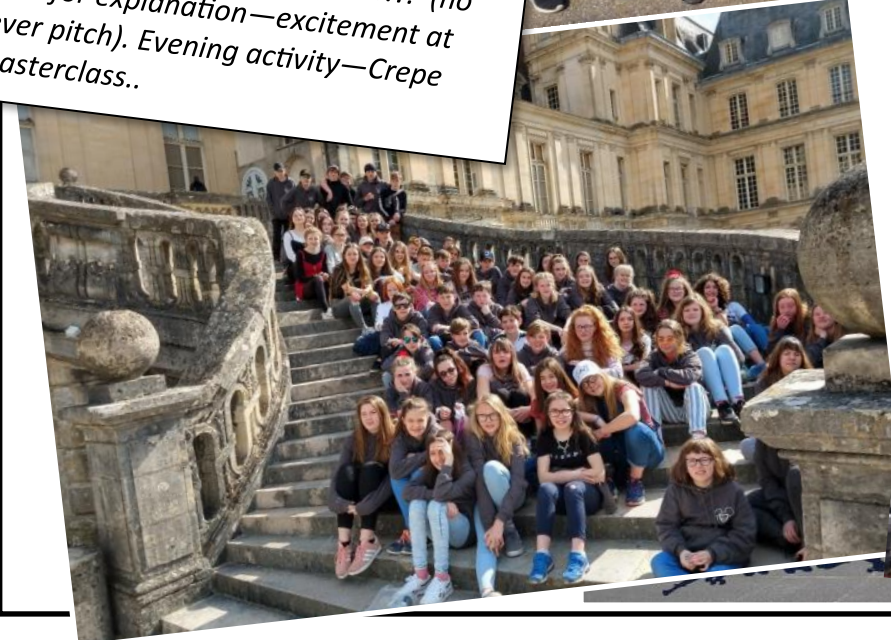
