RLS ENGLISH WEEK

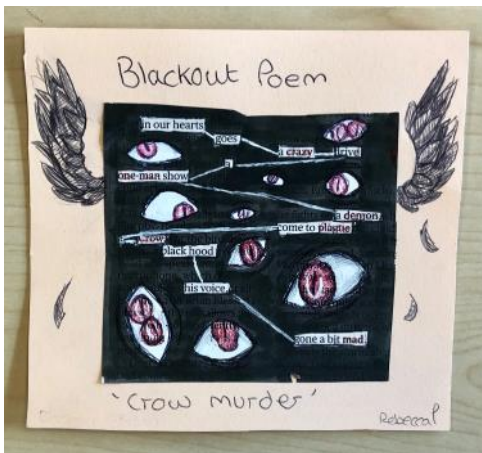
Last week Richard Lander School students enjoyed a week of extra-curricular English activities.

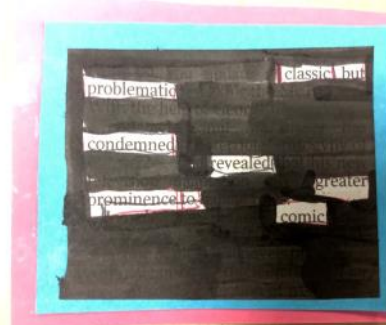
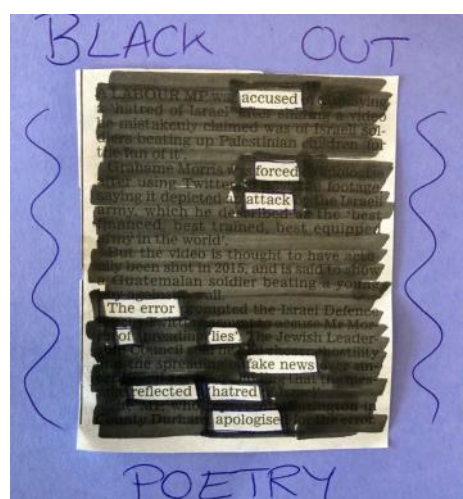
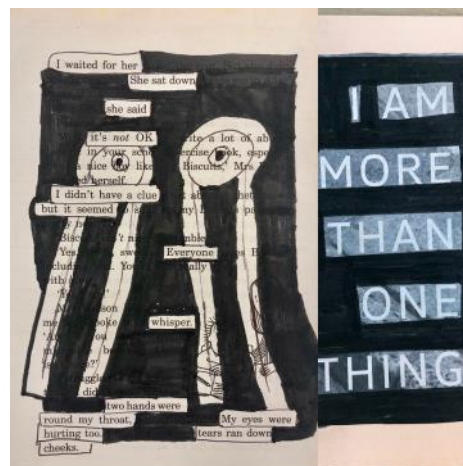
Congratulations to the winning team, 'To win or not to win?' a.k.a. Holly, Ryn, Bella, Gerran and Ms Hughes, who were closely followed

Blackout poetry on Thursday and creative writing on Friday.





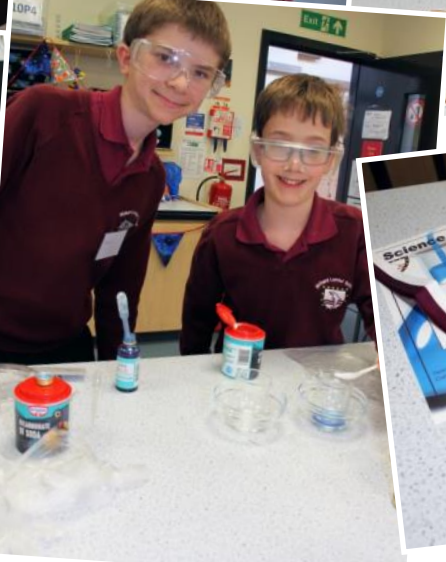
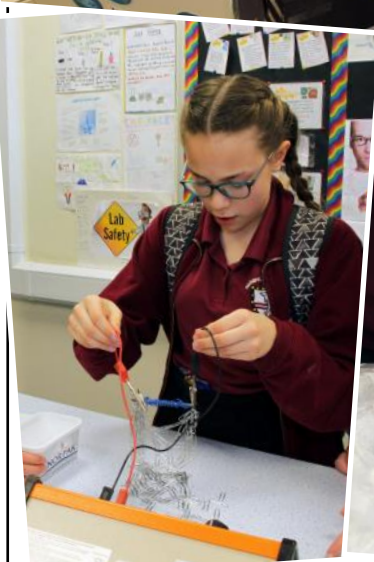
BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK - RLS SCIENCE FAIR

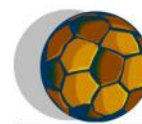

There has been a small increase in the cost of school meals. The most recent increase before this one in the cost of school meals was September 2017. With effect from Tuesday the 23rd April Autograph meal prices will increase as below:-

- Pupil Paid meal £2.35
- Adult Paid (2 course) meal £3.72
- Adult Paid (main course only) £2.78
- Adult Dessert £0.92

This is in line with the PFI Contract for the indexation of school meal prices, which is equates to a 3.3% price increase as agreed by the Authority.

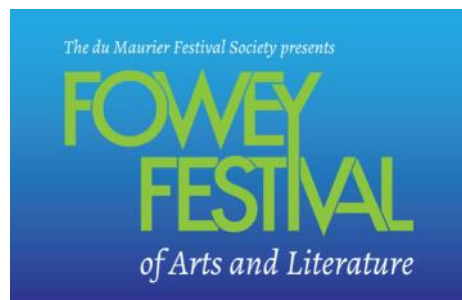


FOWEY FESTIVAL AWARDS FOR YOUNG WRITERS AND ARTISTS

Mental Health Awareness Week - body image

Hosted by the Mental Health Foundation, [Mental Health Awareness Week 2019](#) will take place from Monday 13 to Sunday 19 May 2019. The theme for 2019 is Body Image – how we think and feel about our bodies.

As part of Mental Health Awareness Week:

- MHF will be publishing the results of a UK-wide survey on body image and mental health.
 - MHF will look at body image issues across a lifetime – including how it affects children and young people, adults and people in later life.
 - MHF will also highlight how people can experience body image issues differently, including people of different ages, genders, ethnicities and sexualities.


