Message from the Headteacher: Emergency School Closure

hould the school need to close in an emergency situation (such as snow closure) then we will follow the guidance from the Local Authority available here. Supporting this, our own procedures include the following:

Emergency closure occur whilst school is in session:

- The Headteacher will notify Governors and the Local Authority that the school will close. The LA will inform local radio stations
- An email and automated telephone call will be sent to parents to notify them of the school closure
- Using student mobile phones or the school administrative phones, we will attempt to make contact with all parents/carers to grant permission to release their children from school. Should we be unable to make contact with parents/carers:

Students whose parent/carer has signed the consent form to release their child to go home in the case of an emergency school closure (below) will be released from school

Students whose parent/carer has not signed the consent form will not be permitted to go home until direct telephone contact has been made between the tutor and parent. (This may delay student departure from school and transport home on service buses)

Parents/carers will be informed via email, the school website and radio announcement regarding further closure days.

Emergency closure outside of school hours:

- The Headteacher will notify Governors and the Local Authority that the school will close. The LA will inform local radio stations
- Parents/carers will be informed via email, school website and local radio announcement
- Parents/carers will be informed via email, school website and radio announcement regarding further closure days.

Note: the school will make contact with parents/carers who have not signed the relevant consent form, requesting permission to release their child from school in the case of an emergency school closure.

Greenpower application forms are available to collect from the cars area opposite student reception. All students need to apply through this process. The deadline for applications is the 26th January.

About the process:

Once application has been received, students may be shortlisted before being invited to a workshop where they will be given a task to complete. The decision is primarily made by the existing team members who retain their place (unless they've lost interest or have shown a lack of commitment).

The existing team members use a decision matrix to score the applicants on team work; leadership; technical awareness; communication and listening skills. This provides a level of objective decision making to make the process as fair as possible in the face of huge levels of interest from the students.





Produced by **BBC FILMS**, the **BFI** and **CREATIVE ENGLAND**, 'Make Up' is a psychological thriller set on a caravan park in Cornwall about a young woman who is drawn into a mysterious obsession when she suspects her boyfriend has cheated on her.

ROLES

RUTH - LEAD ROLE

Self-contained and rational, Ruth just wants to be normal. But when she decides to spend the winter on a remote caravan park with her boyfriend TOM, her repressed desires begin to haunt her. She finds herself increasingly paranoid and she develops an obsession with a mysterious woman. At the end of the film RUTH has to face up to her deepest fears and question her own sexuality in order to discover what this obsession is really about.

FEMALE | AGE - 19 - 25 years old | ETHNICITY - Any

TOM - SUPPORTING ROLE

RUTH'S boyfriend of 3 years. On first impressions TOM appears confident and at ease with himself, he seems like a loveable and happy-go-lucky character, but as the story continues, we see that this is mostly bravado: he wants to be liked and it becomes clear that he is terrified of losing Ruth, and will do anything to keep her. MALE | AGE - 19 - 25 years old | ETHNICITY - Any

JADE - SUPPORTING ROLE

Confident, talkative, funny and bold (first seen wearing lilac lipstick), JADE'S outward strength belies a warm heart and insightful understanding of people. Self-described beautician, hairdresser and agony aunt, she has a strong desire to help people, perhaps because she is a bit of an outcast herself. She develops a close friendship with Ruth that turns into more at the end of the film. FEMALE | AGE - 25 - 30 | ETHNICITY - Any

KAI - SUPPORTING ROLE

Competitive and egocentric, KAI lives and works on the park. He is TOM's boss and friend but we are never sure of his motives. He is macho and cocky with a crude and juvenile sense of humour, which he uses to cover up his burning jealousy of RUTH: he hates that she is taking TOM away from him and doesn't believe in love. MALE | AGE - 19 - 25 years old | ETHNICITY - Any

SHIRLEY - SUPPORTING ROLE

No-nonsense, self-reliant and runs the caravan park. SHIRLEY has worked there for 30 years and uses a wheelchair. She has 'seen it all before' and appears gruff but with a dry sense of humour. She often acts in her own self-interest but laughs readily with a distinctive cackle.

FEMALE | AGE - 50 - 70 | ETHNICITY - Any

KIPPA - SUPPORTING ROLE

Upfront, confident and observant, KIPPA has a fearlessness about her and gets straight to the point, asking RUTH personal questions, and wanting to understand everything.

FEMALE | AGE - 10 - 14 years old | ETHNICITY - Any
