

#### Year 9 - Cornish Schools Chef Competition

ear 9 students were given the opportunity to take part in the Cornish Schools Chef Competition organised by St Austell Brewery. The company are committed to nurturing young local talent and to highlighting opportunities careers in the hospitality sector, and so introduced this competition to local schools last year. It was an intensive process that started in September 2017 with videos about the profession and details about the competition sent to students from Brannel School, Penrice Academy, Richard Lander School and the Roseland Academy. Head Chefs from the Brewery's estate of pubs, inns and hotels visited the students to mentor them alongside teachers.

In the School round eight students took part and were judged on their

ideas for a main course, based on a list of ingredients supplied by the The competition was Brewery. judged by Max Savage from Havener's Restaurant in Fowey. Max was a former student at Richard Lander, and it was great that he was the students mentor chef. From this stage Abbie Harrison and Isabelle West were chosen to represent the school in the final. For the finals the girls had to cook a three course meal for two covers. Again they were given a list of ingredients to develop their main and dessert courses. They could then develop their own starter course from their choice of ingredients. Over December and January the students were mentored by Max, who helped the girls to develop their dishes and to practice cooking them in the allocated time of two hours. All ingredients were provided by the Brewery and through a lot of time spent practicing the girls gained in

confidence and perfected their dishes. Their final menus were:

#### <u>Isabelle</u>

Davidstow Cheddar Soufflé, apple and pomegranate salad.

Fried mackerel with roasted butternut squash, celeriac and golden beetroot, crushed potatoes and a cream and mushroom sauce.

Orange and Thyme crème patisserie tart with chocolate pastry, finished with a chocolate sauce and raspberry coulis and caramelised sugar.

#### **Abbie**

Pan fried Cornish prawns on blinis with a chilli and lemongrass marinade.

Grilled chilli mackerel with crushed potatoes.









Fondant chocolate puddings with pear in a butterscotch sauce.

On January 23rd the finals took place at Cornwall College and saw the eight young students with dreams of being the next Jamie Oliver battle it out in a two-hour cooking competition. Over two hours of wafting aromas, the bustle of pots, pans, steam and heat in a tense atmosphere, the eight finalists put their cooking skills that they'd learnt over the last few months to the test.

At the end of the two-hour competition, judges Kirstie Worrall, our Head of Food and Steve Rudd from Cornwall College's Catering Department were presented with a tableful of delicious food that was very well presented and both were suitably impressed. Isabelle was praised for her perfectly risen and amazingly tasty cheese souffle and also for her patisserie work for her dessert. Abbie was given a special mention for her perfectly seasoned and flavoured grilled mackerel.



Both Isabelle and Abbie did brilliantly and both produced their best quality dishes when it mattered. The competition was finally won by a student from the Roseland Academy.

As part of her prize, the winner will cook her three-course meal with her Head Chef mentor and the St Austell Brewery chefs at a special gala evening at the Brewery's

Visitor Centre and her dishes will also become part of our Visitor Centre Specials Board. All finalist including Abbie and Isabelle will be invited to attend the Gala evening with their families and mentors.

This was an excellent opportunity for the students and they did themselves and the School proud. Well done girls.



#### Richard Lander School - SAFEGUARDING UPDATE

Indecent / embarrassing image of you online? You can get rid of it.

We would like to make you aware of the YOTI app which has been verified as legitimate by the National Crime Agency.

Childline and the Internet Watch Foundation have come together to provide a service where children can request the removal of sexual images of themselves which have been shared online. As part of that process the child would be asked to provide a link to where the image is stored online, rather than send the image itself.



The child is also required to verify their identity and age and this is done through the YOTI app. YOTI will not store images of the child's ID following the verification process.

# CyberFirst Adventurers is a free one-day development course aimed at students who have not yet made their GCSE choices (11 to 14 year-olds\*) and their parents/guardians.

The course is designed to showcase the varied roles and jobs that both exist and involve the use of technology in the workplace, to enthuse and inspire the participants into an interest in technology. It is also designed to counter the stereotype that computer science is a subject that only leads to jobs in programming and coding. The course is aimed at students who have not yet made their GCSE choices, so that they get the opportunity to see how studying computer science could potentially augment and enhance their future career prospects.

As student's GCSE choices are often made in conjunction with their parents/guardians, teachers and careers advisors, the course is designed to involve these adults too, so that they can see the benefit of students studying computer science, as well as how positive a mutual experience it can be.

Our CyberFirst Adventurers courses run on a Saturday between 10:00 and 15:30 at selected UK mainland universities and colleges. Each event consists of four themed modules offering interactive, hands on, self-guided, exploratory learning that reduces the amount of time spent in traditional instructor led presentations to the very minimum. The four career based themes covered are:

Problem solving and teamworking in a technical environment, medicine, web development/art and design and sports science.
