#### **Combined Truro Schools Art Project**

very year we have an ongoing collaboration with other Truro Schools which involves an in school project as well as selected students being able to take part in workshops run by artists. The project has a different annual theme and this year it has been STEAM to promote and engage art alongside Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths . Across the course of the year we work with other local schools to arrange workshops and an in school project around the chosen theme. This year there were workshops for selected students at Truro Museum working with a painter to respond to some of the geology artefacts that they have at the museum.

A later workshop at Goonhilly involved learning photography techniques to record the interesting landscape and buildings at the earth station . These photos went on to inform a further workshop with a print maker . Within school some Year 8 students worked on a project to create designs that were then transferred onto circuit boards . Each piece was then planned to be put together as a jewellery piece which was displayed on a mannequin . Tom Lyall in Year 8 also did a fantastic detailed drawing based on Cornish minining heritage which was then transferred onto a screen and created into a screen print .

Every year at the end of the project there is an annual exhibition of students work and this year the work was displayed in Truro Museum . There was a opening night for the exhibition which allowed students and friends and family to see their work on display in such a prestigious venue .

#### Artist workshop

At the end of term we arranged for an artist to come into school to work with selected Year 7 and 8 students. Artist Peter Margerum has a background in delivering workshops using recycled materials to create sculptures. On the day Peter arrived with boxes and boxes of found and reclaimed materials from bottle tops to bicycle parts and lots in between . he talked to the students about his own work and artistic background and went on to teach the students how to use the materials to create animals and creatures . it was amazing how the pieces of metal , wire and plastic were transformed into such imaginative outcomes . The student had a fantastic creative day and learnt a huge amount about how to transform recycled and reclaimed objects into something really exciting.

Truro Cathedral is thrilled that the BBC Concert Orchestra will be travelling to Cornwall in order to join Truro Cathedral Choir for what promises to be a very special concert. The theme for the concert is 'nature' and it will feature independent pieces by the choir and the orchestra, before they come together with children from Richard Lander School, Truro School, Truro High School for Girls and Cornwall Youth Chamber Choir, to perform the premiere of a new work by Dobrinka Tabakova, written especially for the occasion. The spectacular line-up will be further enhanced by world acclaimed cellist, Natalie Clein, who will join the orchestra for the evening. The BBC Radio 3 team will also be present and recording the entire concert for later broadcast.

#### Dobrinka Tabakova



Named as one of the 10 young composers who are redefining classical music by Culture Trip, Dobrinka Tabakova's music has been described as 'exciting, deeply moving' (Washington Times), full of 'glowing tonal harmonies and grand, sweeping gestures [which]

convey a huge emotional depth' (The Strad). She has been commissioned by the Royal Philharmonic Society, BBC Radio 3 and orchestras throughout Europe. Last year, Dobrinka was appointed composer-inresidence with the BBC Concert Orchestra.

Dobrinka has been composer-in-residence with Truro Cathedral for the past 18 months, part-funded by Arts Council England, working particularly with the Girl Choristers and local schools. The concert tonight will see the culmination of the residency with the premiere of her new choral work, which sets words from the poem Kynance Cove by Cornish poet John Harris. The following day, all performers will record the new work for release on CD later in the year.

The mission of the BBC Concert Orchestra is to bring inspiring musical experiences to everyone, everywhere, with the ensemble's great versatility as the key. The orchestra can be heard regularly on BBC Radio 2's Friday Night Is Music Night, and for BBC Radio 3 it searches out the unusual and quirky, profiling classical masterpieces in an entertaining way.



Experience creativity through art and design. Come and work in our specialist studios alongside our expert tutors. Get creative using a variety of materials, building your art and design skills by using different processes each day.

#### Jewellery Monday or Tuesday

Using forming and doming techniques you will be making unusual bead-like jewellery components. You will be encouraged to use texture and shape by using the rolling mill and other metal work tools and skills. The finished forms could be used to create a variety of jewellery pieces such as lockets, pendants, rings or earrings.

#### Photography Monday or Friday

Explore photographic techniques and skills using both digital and analog processes to create some stunning images. Use cameras, computers, paper and chemicals and produce a range of images to take home.

#### Pottery/Ceramics Tuesday or Friday

We will start by exploring different textures and surfaces around the college. These textures will be transferred to clay slabs. You will be taught the technique of slab building to build your chosen style of pot. Be it a mug, a jug, a desk tidy or vase. You will then decorate your pot with coloured clays. Through this hands-on ceramics workshop you'll find out how far your creativity and ideas can take you.

#### Digital Drawing Wednesday

This introduction to digital drawing provides learners with the opportunity to experiment with both traditional and digital drawing techniques. Using a graphics tablet you will learn how to combine these different ways of working to produce a range of character concept designs for a video game.

#### **3D** Thursday

Exploring a range of surface manipulation techniques you will design and create your own personalised phone or iPod case. Creative techniques such as applique, melted plastics, paper cutting and hand stitching will be experimented with and form the surface of your final piece. You will be the designer of this project and will be supported in using your creativity to produce a phone/iPod case to take home with you.
