WELCOME BACK!

Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents / Carers,

Welcome back to a new term – I hope that your child or children have settled back into the new term well. Judging by the smiles and positivity at school this week, I think this is the case.

May I take this opportunity to thank all parents, carers and indeed staff who contributed to the appeal which I set up last term with regard to my work over the summer holidays, supporting Syrian refugee children in Lebanon. The charity I worked with (SB Overseas) provides an education to Syrian refugee children where they have no access to a government education. SB Overseas has three schools and these are based in Beirut (the capital of Lebanon), Saida and Arsal. Arsal is very close to the Syrian border and the refugees there have been living in temporary accommodation (UN tents) for seven years now.

The SB Overseas staff were delighted with the funds raised within the Richard Lander school community and this has gone towards providing educational resources for refugee children.

Most of my work in the SB Overseas schools was focused on providing guidance to the school leadership and wider staff team, providing training for staff, policy writing and formulation of schemes of work. The most exciting moments however, was when I was able to teach – the Syrian refugee children were just delightful and eager to gain an education.

One of our key themes this academic year will be to encourage students to be caring towards others and to make a positive difference to the world around them. I hope that my own experience this summer will provide motivation for students to also go the extra mile and to use whatever talents they have for the good of others.

Class of 2018 celebrate excellent GCSE results!

here were smiles all round on GCSE results day with our retiring Y11 students celebrating truly excellent results.

As you will see from the breakdown on the right most results showed an improvement over last year with over a quarter of students getting 5 or more 9-7 grades which are equivalent to the old A/A* and 86% students passing their English GCSE, 74% passing both English and maths.

There were some particularly notable individual successes including those pictured on these pages. Below: Superstars Ella, Freya and Chloe, who achieved 10 Grades at grade 9 to 7 each and Jess who achieved 9 Grade 9's and one grade A*.

RICHARD LANDER SCHOOL GCSE RESULT BREAKDOWN 2018



- Over a quarter of students gained 5 or more 9-7 grades – equivalent to the old A/A* grade
- 18 students gained 9 or more 9-7 grades
- 25 students gained 8 or more 9-7 grades
- 34% of our students gained a 9-7 grade in English
- 23% of our students gained a 9-7 grade in maths
- 74% of our students passed both English and maths (9-4)
- 86% of our students gained a pass in English (9-4)
- 76% of our students gained a pass in maths (9-4)

first year student, Louise Hope was
feeling slightly anxious about her
first day at secondary school.
Looking very smart in her grey skirt
and V-neck jumper, white shirt and
red tie with silver stripes she joined
Mr Axon's tutor group. Louise
remembers sitting in the main hall
listening to Headteacher, Mr Dunn
(below), and feeling guilty about
every misdemeanour he
mentioned. As her face turned

redder by the minute, she worried that she would be seen as a culprit although she had done nothing wrong. Fortunately

things improved after that first day and Louise went on to thoroughly enjoy her time at Richard Lander School.

Mrs Hope qualified as a Science teacher in 2002 and remembers: "One of the loveliest things was when Mr Axon, my first tutor, turned up unexpectedly at my graduation. He gave me a congratulations card and wished me all the best in my career as a teacher. That's what it is like at Richard Lander, we always look out for our past students; we are delighted when they do well." Mrs Hope started her first job at Richard Lander School in the September of 2002. 16 years later, she still works at the school and is now the Key Stage 3 Science lead and is also a year 11 tutor.

Mrs Hope recalls her parents



having to come in to convince the school to allow her to do triple science in 1981. At that time science was very male dominated. she and quite a few other girls were permitted to study triple science, and Mrs Hope went on to do a Biochemistry degree, work in a research lab and of course, became a science teacher. It is heartening to see how times have changed. Earlier this year a group of 4 of Richard Lander School's very own female students won the Satelife competition with an amazing idea for a wrist band that is linked to a satellite to enable people to be found in the sea.

Richard Lander School's longest serving member of staff is Mr Glenn Gibson who has been at the school for 38 years. He joined the school and became Louise Hope's tutor when she was in year 3 in 1980. Louise remembers 'it was his first job, I taught him how to take the register.' Mr Gibson remembers what a bright and helpful student Louise was. In 1980 Mr Gibson taught Geography and PE, he is now Assistant Headteacher in charge of Key Stage 4 Pastoral. His fantastic memory also makes him a bit of a Richard Lander Wikipedia for students and staff!

'Debate Create' - A day of debate and interactive creative workshops at Falmouth University

n Friday 29th June, a group of Year 9 students were given the opportunity to visit Falmouth University with Mrs Nortje and Mr Gell for the annual Debate Create event. On arrival, we were invited to watch a panel of experts discuss what the world will be like in the future; topics ranged from artificial intelligence to migrants. Some of us posed questions to the panel that we had thought of at school, whilst all of us could vote in the interactive questions (such as "In the future there will be less jobs for humans. Do you agree or disagree?"). Once the debate had finished, everybody was split up into their groups – theatre, TV post production, creative advertising, journalism and photography. Each group's task was to create something that they could then showcase to the attending schools.

Participants in the theatre workshop began by warming up with some collaborative exercises before deciding to base their work

around the theme of robots outperforming humans and securing their jobs. The end product was a chilling performance depicting a robot dictatorship.

Meanwhile, the TV post production group learnt about the dangers refugees face in their countries. Together, they created a voice over for an emotive video about the hardships in war-torn countries.

The creative advertising group was given the option to promote either some existing technology or a trip to Mars. All of the work produced was of an extremely high quality, and some pieces added humour to the end presentations.

After a quick general knowledge quiz, everybody doing journalism had to make a two-minute video – including an interview – about the

Cornwall School Games (which were taking place around the campus). They also made a short radio clip focused on the advantages and disadvantages of attending university, and even got to speak to prestigious journalist Kevin Bishop in Russia over Skype!

The photography group created some powerful images focused around homelessness before producing some futuristic pictures with torchlight. Additionally, some students made short animations by lying on the floor to make it seem like they were fighting, flying or walking.

Overall, the workshops were a huge success and allowed each of us to experience lots of new and interesting skills within the University environment.

Welcome back from the Music Department!


