### IMPORTANT UPDATE ON WEARING FACE COVERING IN SCHOOL The government have updated its guidance for the wearing of face coverings in school. The communication received by schools from the DfE is detailed below (see *italic* text): An update for all education and childcare settings following the Prime Minister's announcement of the end of Plan B Today, the Prime Minister announced that all Plan B measures will be removed in England, with a full return to Plan A by Thursday 27 January. In education and childcare settings, this means: From tomorrow, Thursday 20 January, face coverings are no longer recommended in classrooms and teaching spaces for staff, and pupils and students in year 7 and above. They were introduced in classrooms at the start of the Spring term as a temporary measure. From Thursday 27 January, face coverings are no longer recommended in communal areas for staff, and pupils and students in year 7 and above. This decision comes in response to national infection data showing the prevalence of COVID-19 to be on a downward trajectory. Whilst there are some groups where cases are likely to continue rising, it is likely that the Omicron wave has now peaked nationally. There remains significant pressure on the NHS but hospital admissions have stabilised, and the number of patients in Intensive Care Units (ICU) remain low and are falling. This means it is right we remove the most stringent restrictions around wearing face coverings from education, but the virus is still with us, and continuing with proportionate protective measures remains vital to protect education. Local directors of public health are able to recommend the use of face coverings in communal areas, across their area only, where DfE and public health experts judge the measure to be proportionate due to specific health concerns. This is a temporary measure. Directors of public health will continue to advise individual settings experiencing outbreaks. Any local introduction of face coverings will be subject to routine review and removed at the earliest opportunity. Therefore, the school will be implementing this advice, notably that: From Thursday 20 January 2022, face coverings will no longer be required in classrooms From Thursday 27 January 2022, face coverings will not be required in communal areas (and will remain the case unless local directors of public health assess it should change, given local rates of Covid-19) We await further guidance from the DfE regarding the wearing of face coverings on school transport. In the meantime, we recommend students continue wearing face coverings on school transport. Many students and staff will likely continue to want to wear face coverings both in the classroom and in communal settings. Such a decision has the full support of the school and we will continue to hold supplies of face coverings for any student who wishes to wear one. May I take this opportunity to thank students and parents for their support with the wearing of face coverings to this point. The vast majority of students and parents have worked to support the school throughout the various Covid-19 related policy decisions over the last two years and the school leadership team has valued this support. #### **TEN TORS TRAINING RETURNSAFTER 2 YEAR BREAK**

Last Saturday saw 20 students and 6 staff parking at Meldon Reservoir and stomping up Higher Willhays/Yes Tor to the highest point on Dartmoor, which is actually it's the highest point in UK south of Brecon Beacons.

The walk also provided expanses of 'baby heads' - those tuffets that can make a walk rather hard going - a beautiful (nearly full) moon and sunset and curious and playful Dartmoor ponies. An amazing team of very strong and moorworthy students had an excellent day of training in mild & kind weather and we are all looking forward to the next one already. The next training walk is scheduled for 29th January.



#### **RLS WASTE LESS CANTEEN - UPDATE—TERRACYCLE**

In November 2021 we introduced our Waste Less Canteen initiative which saw us replacing the vast majority of our single use canteen waste with washable items. In the first weeks, Duke of Edinburgh volunteers helped to get students used to the new system and sorted recycling bins.

The new initiative has gone very smoothly with students adapting to clearing their plates and cutlery very well and, as a result, we have diverted thousands of items from the incinerator already.

Since half term, Duke of Edinburgh volunteers have been creating an eye catching collection bin for crisp bags and chocolate biscuit wrappers. These will then be sent to TerraCycle. TerraCycle recycle the "non-recyclable." and divert millions of pounds of waste from landfills and incinerators each month. The waste is recycled into a raw material and sold to manufacturing companies who produce the end product and complete the journey of recycling. These end products may include outdoor furniture and decking, plastic shipping pallets, watering cans, storage containers and bins, tubes for construction applications, flooring tiles, playground surface covers and athletic fields, and much more. We look forward to introducing the new TerraCycle 'bin' next week and hope it will help our packed lunch students with crisp bags and chocolate biscuit wrappers to be more responsible with their waste. These initiatives along with Mrs Knight's used pen recycling, the DT department's milk bottle, gluestick, HDPE and PPE shredding and pressing, and the school recycling bins should really help to reduce our school's waste.

#### DUKE OF EDINBURGH—BRONZE AWARD

his year, I'm well into my DofE journey, and have completed all of my sections needed (Physical, Volunteering, and Skills), now only waiting on the expedition in April. I'm currently in Year 10, and having started my Duke of Edinburgh Bronze in Year 9. During the pandemic, it was harder than usual to find activities to do that would fit the criteria for each section. After organising my group, I looked at the examples and links signposting me towards activities that I could do for each section, I found this incredibly helpful and started navigating my way through the DofE app.

Skills—I chose to do this for 6 months, using 'ELFhub', a website that trainee nurses use, that has mini quizzes and information packs on it, my main focus for the quizzes was learning more about midwifery. I really enjoyed doing this, so it was easy to make up the hours required. Using the app, I posted on social media to raise awareness about St John's Ambulance for my **Volunteering**. I found it useful and gained valuable knowledge about subjects such as CPR and how to deal with emergency situations, also uploading photo evidence through the app for my assessor to mark as completed.

For my **Physical** section, I took up running, using the 'Couchto5K' app and Strava to record sessions, and went on dog walks with my family. After doing this for 3 months, I did manage to successfully beat the 5K target, and found my fitness improving; the photos I used as evidence showed my route and how long it took.

To upload evidence to the app or website, you need an assessor. Login, and go onto the relevant section, such as physical, I've used mine as an example (top right). Scroll down to the bottom of the page after submitting your information, click manage evidence, and there should be two choices to either submit a text or photograph as evidence. From there it should be easy:, either describe what you did, and if you reached any of your goals, or upload a photo.

Throughout my DofE, I've found myself becoming more independent and confident, and I can't wait to do my expedition with my group in April. I would 100% recommend doing Dofe to everyone who is interested.

The winning design in 8RD1 was by Josh and Jayden with an amazing 186 marbles before the boat sank. It was a really enjoyable, fun session with some fantastic designs.

#### YEAR 10 GCSE TEXTILES - SKETCHBOOK WORK

U ur Year 10 GCSE textiles students take such a pride in their sketchbooks which become something we hope many of them will keep forever. This week we have been featuring their work on social media:







Stunning sketchbook work from Year 10 GCSE Textiles students Emily and Flo. At the beginning of the course students are encouraged to find interesting patterns and textures in the unnoticed and then to develop their own mark making from these.

Having developed their mark making, students create mood boards in PowerPoint and then use the colour picker to create a palette of colours. They then use these colours to create a collage and weaving. Beautiful exploration of colour and texture, by Pollyanna and Amy, in these Year 10 GCSE Textiles sketchbooks.





Students move on from their mark making and colour palette exploration to creating striking repeating patterns, the basis of fabric design.

The 1950s project then begins with students researching this iconic decade along with the work of British textile artist, Lucienne Day. They develop their own embellished print, before starting their 1950s project. We can't wait to see how their work develops!

# Taster days at Cornwall College's St Austell and Camborne campuses are scheduled to run face to face on the 18th February 2022 from 5pm – 7pm




