We would like to congratulate the class of 2021 on their super exam results!

You had more disruption to your Key Stage 4 education than any other year group in Richard Lander School's history, yet you stayed strong, conscientious and positive throughout and we are so grateful for the way you set the example to younger students during the pandemic; meeting each new challenge with maturity and acceptance.

It therefore comes as no surprise to us that you have achieved so well in your exam results. We are just sorry that we were not able to hand them to you in person. Nevertheless we are so proud of you - **our highest achieving year group to date!** The class of 2021 achieved some fantastic exam results

- Over a third of students gained 5 or more 9-7 grades – the equivalent to the old A/A* grade
- 69% of students gained 5 or more 9-5 grades
- 83% of students gained 5 or more 9-4 grades the equivalent to the old C grade
- 35 students gained 9 or more 9-7 grades
- 12 students gained 5 or more grade 9s. Of these,
 3 students gained grade 9 in 8 of their chosen courses.
- 39% of students gained a 9-7 grade in English
- 30% of students gained a 9-7 grade in maths
- 79% of students passed both English and maths
- 76% of students gained a pass in English (9-5)
- 61% of students gained a pass in maths (9-5)
- 87% of students gained a pass in English (9-4)
- 81% of students gained a pass in maths (9-4)

Students were encouraged to carefully consider the needs of others, how to consider humanitarianism within their design solutions, and also got to look at a Shelter Box survival kit that are donated to countries in need of aid.

DUKE OF EDINBURGH - BRONZE AWARD

his weekend 44 Year 10 students completed their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze expedition.

To complete this section of their award students had to plan, train for and complete an unaccompanied, self-reliant expedition by their own physical efforts with minimal external intervention and without motorised assistance. The expedition needed to be for a minimum of 2 days and 1 night with 6 hours of planned activity each day.

4 groups of students set off from school at 8am on Saturday to walk to Portreath, while another 4 groups of students were minibussed to Portreath to do the route in reverse. Along the way students had to complete knot tying challenges at 5 checkpoints.

Having returned to base, cooked their dinner on a Trangia stove and spent the night under canvas on the school meadow, students were up early on Sunday ready for their second day of the challenge - a trek to Trelissick.

All 44 students completed the challenge, with no one dropping out despite plenty of blisters, getting lost and very tired legs. Everyone should be very proud of themselves; the DofE staff team are certainly proud of you all!

These 44 are the second group of Y10 student to complete their Bronze award expedition, with 48 students undertaking a similar expedition before the summer break. We look forward to supporting a further 80+ Y10 students in their expeditions and welcoming new Year 9 recruits to the DofE fold. Many of our Year 10 DofE Bronze graduates are now planning to move on to the Silver award.

Richard Lander School CO-OPTED GOVERNORS REQUIRED

At Richard Lander School we are looking for a number co-opted Governors to join our Governing body. As a Governor you will be a volunteer who makes a vital contribution to the success of the school.

This role may be particularly of interest if you have skills in finance/accounting, human resources, careers or education but we invite applications from anyone who is interested in helping the school be the best it can be. Full training is available and governors are encouraged to attend training sessions, either in person or online.

We are looking for someone who can attend approximately five full governing body meetings per year and around three to six committee meetings per year. Meetings are held in school (currently remotely), usually on Wednesday afternoons at 4.30pm. Governors also spend time in school during the day (around one to two visits per term).

School Governors have three main roles.

Governors ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.

The Governing Body helps to set long-terms plans for the school, decide where improvements need to be made and how to make them.

Governors hold the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and the effective and efficient performance management of staff.

The Governing Body looks at the quality of education being offered and ensures the head is doing everything possible to improve results.

•Governors oversee the financial performance of the school and make sure its money is well spent.

Governors examine budgets and spending proposals to monitor whether the school is getting value for money and ensure the money is spent in the right areas.
