

We are working towards having a group of students in the school that can act as a support network if a student has any worries, instead of approaching a teacher, as some students might prefer this.


A specialist ambassador in young people's mental health took students through how to cope with situations like panic attacks and stress, with the key

RLS YOUTH ACTIVISTS MEET WITH TRURO/ FALMOUTH MP TO TALK ABOUT HOUSING CRISIS

Richard Lander Youth Activists met with MP for Truro and Falmouth, Cherilyn Mackrory, to discuss their research on the housing crisis in Cornwall. Their research showed just 5 family homes available for rent in Truro, at average rent of £1200!

This was a great opportunity to talk to a person who is best placed to make a difference and we are very grateful to Mrs Mackrory for making time to come in to listen to our student's concerns.

One of our students, Elowyn, had a particular concern about homelessness (vagrancy) being a crime and Mrs Mackrory said she would raise this, on her behalf, in parliament. We are really looking forward to hearing how this addressed. *Elowyn Cotteril-Jury has written about the meeting*

Our meeting with our MP Cherilyn Mackrory was really useful and interesting. She agreed with us that there is a problem with housing here in Cornwall and reflected on her personal experiences of how she struggled to find a home in the county. Ms Mackrory felt there were many issues but mainly focused on the fact that there


were very few affordable homes and vast amounts of second homes. When we posed the question of how she could safeguard our futures here in Cornwall her response was that it was extremely important to her and that she considers it her job to make sure we have a safe and secure future in Cornwall.

Cherilyn did give some practical ideas of how they are trying to improve the situation, such as converting above shop flats and abandoned areas into affordable homes. They are also considering the environmental impact of all of the house building and trying to find ways that have less of an impact.

As a group we felt much more informed after our meeting with Ms Mackrory and that her input was very insightful for us. We greatly appreciated her giving up her time for us and hope that she enjoyed the visit too!






WRITING WORKSHOP WITH LISA GLASS

On Tuesday 25th of January, we had the privilege of welcoming established author Lisa Glass into school to run creative writing workshops with two lucky Year 9 English classes. Within the workshop, we were encouraged to open up our imaginations by creating a story and



The second half of the workshop, our focus was poetry. In particular, two poems by different authors which we went on to make our own poems inspired by. The first poem we studied was "Yorkshire pudding rules" by Ian McMillan, one describing the step-bystep process of how to make a Yorkshire pudding, while also depicting niche memories from the author's childhood. Our task was to write a set of instructions, in poetic form, on a topic we had confident knowledge about. "Where I'm from" by George Ella Lyon was the second poem we took a look at. This poem focused on the specific details of growing up and what life was like for the poet in her home environment when she was a child. We were then encouraged to write our own poem, based on George Ella Lyon's, about our own personal family tree and habitat. This task was very popular among the class as people enjoyed describing their unique experiences as children.

We thoroughly enjoyed Lisa's visit as a class and can only hope that we'll have the pleasure of seeing her again.




