SCHOOL PRODUCTION IS BACK!

On Tuesday and Wednesday this week, our school productions C.H.I.P.S. and The Sad Club were performed to extremely impressed audiences.

C.H.I.P.S. (City Hall Inclusive Preservation Society), by Simon Harvey, told the tales and rumours of Truro City Hall's rich history through the eyes of 'Nigel' the foreman in charge of demolition of the hall and construction of the new Hall for Cornwall.

This is a quirky, fun and humorous play, which was performed so



well by our Year 7 Drama Club, who had been directed by Year 9 Drama Leaders. The audience learned of an embarrassing visit by a member of the royal family which resulted in Truro City Council being sworn to secrecy and a certain door remaining locked for 30 years; that international rock stars—Queen—actually played their first gig at Truro City Hall and that the venue also played a vital part in the suffragist fight for votes for women.

It was fantastic to see our newest

students take to the stage with such confidence and skill and wonderful to welcome their families back into school to experience this rich and vital part of the culture here at Richard Lander School.













The Sad Club is a musical by Luke Barnes, about what living in

this world stops us being happy and how we might go about tackling those problems. It's a collection of monologues, songs and duologues from all over time and space.. The music, by Adam Pleeth, is catchy, modern and fantastic. The play was performed in the National Theatre in 2019 and almost certainly would have toured the UK had Covid not intervened.

It was an honour to perform this incredible play and, boy oh boy, did our students do it justice. A remarkably talented group of young actors gave both Tuesday and Wednesday night's performances their all, with perfectly delivered lines with such poignancy and expression, fantastic choreography and powerful singing. Each character was developed and presented so well, you felt as if you knew them. The school band played an incredibly tight, note perfect set.

After 2 years of lockdown this play resonated deeply with us all with it's message that 'you



























are not alone' in your fight with mental demons and the whole experience became strangely uplifting, rather than depressing!

RICHARD LANDER RACING - GOODWOOD GREEPOWER REPORT

After 2 years away, Richard Lander Racing came back with full throttle this weekend as a new Greenpower racing season kicked off with the 'Goodwood Heat'. This was a qualification race for the Finals to be held at the end of the racing season in October. We are competing with our two race winning scratch built cars – RLR 3 and RLR 4 (RLR – Richard Lander Racing) but as we were unable to defend our World championship title (champions 2017, 2018 and 2019) in 2021 due to the Pandemic, we lost our



winning streak and also our coveted car numbers 1 and 2 and started each race near the back of the grid under numbers 70 (RLR 3) and 80 (RLR 4).

We looked great on practice, with both RLR3 and RLR4 running smoothly, and new drivers taking it in their stride. We were starting further back on the grid than we are used to, but the drivers navigated to the front beautifully.

RLR3 and RLR4 were through the majority of Race 1 in positions 1 and 2 respectively, but a crash on the track

red flagged the race and they were unable to finish with 2 minutes to go! This meant there was question as to whether this race would be discounted.

We were back in the race for the 2nd round, but unfortunately due to a connection error, RLR4 lost power after the first few laps. Instead of being devasted, we took the positives and made the RLR4 race another practice for new drivers - with everyone getting a decent drive.

RLR3 held its nerve, even though it was doggedly tailed by APEX in position 2 most of the race. However, always, our ability to understand



battery longevity and gearing, RLR3 started to pull away in the last 10 minutes, to finish way ahead of the pack in position 1.

Well done to all drivers, pit crew and managers. A great sunny day at beautiful Goodwood.




Ten Tors Team Home by Lunchtime Despite Challenging Heat!

Years 9 & 10 vaccines





What vaccinations are my children due? They are in years 9 & 10

My children had some vaccines when they were babies. Is Tetanus/Diphtheria/Polio a booster for this?

Is this 3 injections?

What about the Meningitis ACWY? Is this the same as MMR?

Is it a different vaccine to the Meningitis C?

So...are these another name for the BCG; the one with the 6 needles?

Are these vaccines 'live'?

Is it safe for all these vaccines to be given at the same time?

Does one consent form cover all vaccines?

I can't remember when my children last had their vaccines or which ones they had! Can you help?

My internet is rubbish! How can I give consent?



Your children would be eligible for Tetanus/Diphtheria/Polio and the Meningitis ACWY vaccines. In addition they would also be eligible for the Human Papilloma Virus vaccine (HPV) if they haven't had this already.

Yes. It will be the final dose.

No. It is a 3 in one, so one injection.

MMR is not the same as Meningitis ACWY

It is a vaccine which gives a boost to the Meningitis C but also protects against the A, W and Y strains of Meningitis.

This additional protection is due to an increase in the W strain in particular.

No. The BCG is no longer routinely given.

No. None of these vaccines are live at all.

Yes, it is safe and routinely given together. The HPV vaccine can also be given at the same time as the Tetanus/Diphtheria/Polio and Meningitis ACWY vaccines.

Tetanus/Diphtheria/Polio and Meningitis ACWY are all on the same consent form. You would need to complete a different one for HPV and any other vaccines administer.

Yes, we can help. If you're not sure, please call us on 01872 221105 and we'll be more than happy to help and advise you. There's quite a gap between baby vaccines and school-age, so don't worry if you've forgotten. It happens to us all!


