

On Wednesday 27th April, the RLS Girls U12 Netball team travelled to Newquay Tretherras School to compete in the County Championship. We had high hopes for our girls as they had already played extremely well throughout the Netball season, as well as being runners up in the County Hockey Tournament earlier in the year.

There were 24 schools at the tournament, with 6 in each section for round 1. The Lander girls played steady Netball winning 4 of their 5 games with a narrow loss to Penrice 5-4. Despite this, the team progressed to the top tier section for the final round. Once again, this was a round robin format so it was essential to get as many wins as possible and get off to a good start to calm the nerves. The girls did just that with a 6-1 win over hosts Newquay Tretherras, followed by a 6-0 win against Mounts Bay. Penrice came next and we were desperate to get our revenge for a loss in the previous round. The Lander girls played their best Netball and were more than up to

the task; beating Penrice 7-4. This set them up nicely for the pivotal game against Truro School. Lander had first centre pass but failed to convert and soon found themselves down 2-0. With the games only 8 minutes 1 way, it was touch and go as to whether they would be able to get themselves back into the game. Defenders Ellie and Eva worked so hard to get the turn -overs that were desperately needed and soon the game was level. Shooters Sorcha and Rosie kept calm and soon put Lander into the lead. Centre court players Molly, Sunny and the amazing Maisie playing centre (and captain of the team), dominated the mid court with their tireless work ethic. With a minute to go, Lander nudged ahead 4-3 and a vital turn-over by Eva ensured a win to Lander. The final game against Wadebridge was almost a formality with the highly excited RLS girls winning 5-1.

A huge congratulation to the squad who were an absolute delight to lead and work with on the day; you thoroughly deserved your win. Special thanks to Lucianne Stribley for all of her efforts in coaching the team leading up to the county Championship.


# SCHOOL PRODUCTION—NEXT WEEK!


