RICHARD LANDER RACING - WORLD GREENPOWER CHAMPIONS 2022

We are delighted to tell you that Richard Lander Racing are once again **WORLD GREENPOWER F24 CHAMPIONS** after an eventful weekend at Goodwood Motor Circuit!!

The Greenpower Education trust is a charitable organisation setup to promote the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) subjects, through the design and build of electric racing cars. Races are held around the UK and also further afield in the USA, China, Brazil, and Europe. All cars run the same batteries and motor, and must aim to complete the greatest distance over a 90 minute race, two of which are run at each event.

Richard Lander School has an incredibly dedicated team of drivers and engineers who work all year towards this annual final. In 2017, after many years of coveting this title, Richard Lander Racing became international champions; the team held their title in 2018 and 2019 and were very keen to regain their title in 2022!

For some years now, Richard Lander Racing have been taking 2 cars to Greenpower events, to give the maximum amount of students to opportunity to be a part of the team and both our cars - RLR3 and RLR4 - went to the Goodwood final in 2022, having qualified in previous competition rounds.

Here is a round up of how events happened at the 2022 International Final..

An unexpectedly short practice at 9am left us in the dark on both car performances, partly due to the weather and a fresh wind across the





Race 1 began and immediately we could see that RLR4 was significantly off expected pace.. RLR4 was brought in for mid-race troubleshooting, where a rubbing tyre was found to be the cause of the issue.

RLR3 meanwhile produced a steady pace. But not breaking through with the leaders.

RLR4 entered back into the race, with a pace consistent with the leaders but further chain issues brought RLR4's race 1 to a premature end.

RLR3 finished race 1 in 4th position.

Following race 1 the team carried out a thorough assessment of the cars and went through each part with a fine tooth comb, in readiness for race 2...

Race 2 and both cars started at the front of the grid, a position that gave us hope for a successful start. The team executed brilliant pit stops on both cars and all gremlins disappeared.

The race was very close throughout the whole 90 minutes, with the top 4 cars keeping pace with each other. At the penultimate lap, APEX had taken the lead and was ahead of us by 2 seconds. Then with half a lap to go, and thanks to some amazing driving skills by RLR4 driver Charlie, we overtook APEX on the last lap. Putting us in the lead for the flag, crossing the finish line by 1.1 seconds ahead.

After a nail-biting wait for a result, RLR4 was finally given the official podium position in 1st place and the F24 Champion World Title.

RLR3 gave a good consistent race, and finished in the top 4!!!

Well done and a huge thank you to all staff, students and parents who supported us throughout the weekend. It was another fantastic day for RL Racing and Greenpower!

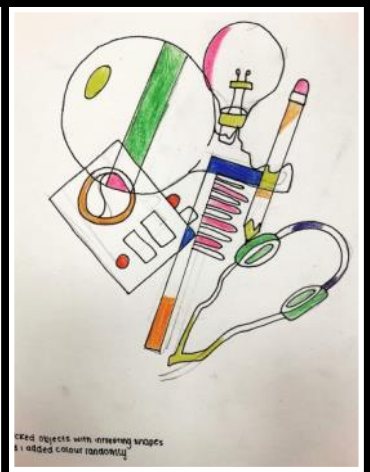

We are also celebrating a few of the black people our history staff find most inspiring on social media. In case you missed them here they are..

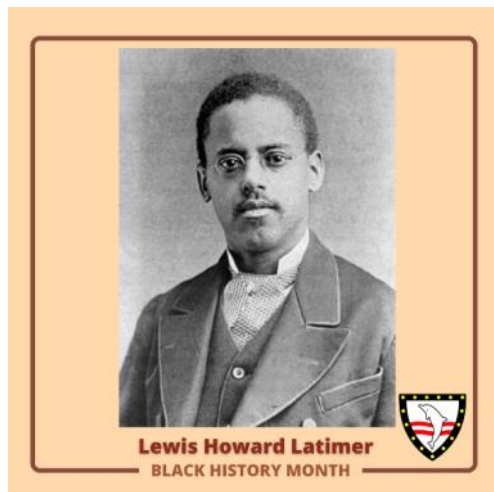
Lieutenant Nyota Uhura from Star Trek played by Nichelle Nichols: Up until Nichols' character appeared on popular American series Star Trek in 1966, every black female on TV had been portrayed as a maid or a menial worker.

Every single one.

Imagine what that does for your aspirations as a young black girl growing up.

Now imagine seeing Lieutenant Uhura for the first time – a successful translator and communications officer who specialises in linguistics, cryptography, and philology. IN SPACE!

Quite a bit of a difference there.!

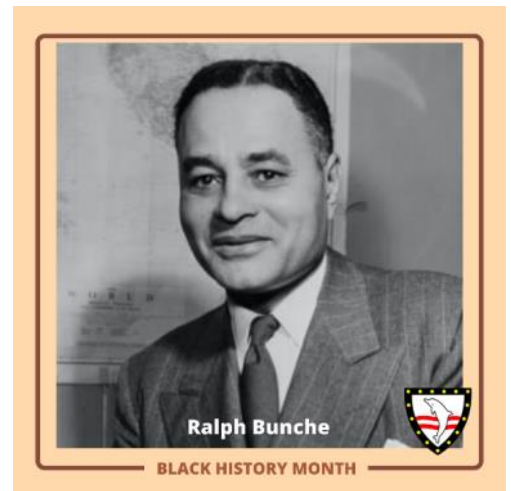


Lewis Howard Latimer had many inventions, but it could be argued that his drawings for Alexander Graham Bell's telephone, helped seal his place in science history. The story goes that Bell was in a race against time, as rivals were also looking to gain patent rights for a similar device. Bell hired Latimer who used his expertise in drawing and submitting patent applications to help Bell file his patent just hours, it said, before his rival in 1876.

By 1880 Latimer had taken up the post of mechanical draughtsman for the inventor Hiram Maxim, who was also the founder of the US Electric Lighting Company. Now focused on incandescent lighting, Latimer along with Joseph Nichols, invented a light bulb which used a carbon filament, an improvement on Thomas Edison's paper filament. The invention, patented in 1881, was sold to the US Electric Lighting Company.

Peace Negotiator in the Middle East - Ralph Bunche

Ralph Bunche was the first African American to be awarded the Peace Prize. He received it for having arranged a cease-fire between Israelis and Arabs during the war which followed the creation of the state of Israel in 1948. Ralph Bunche was a social science graduate and before World War II studied colonial policy in West Africa. He joined the staff of the Swedish social scientist Gunnar Myrdal, who was studying racial segregation in the USA. In World War II, Bunche became the first Afro-American to hold a top job in the State Department. •When the chief UN negotiator Folke Bernadotte was murdered by Jewish extremists in the autumn of 1948, Ralph Bunche had to replace him. In the following year he succeeded in bringing about a cease-fire, after tough negotiations.



'Harriet' was on BBC4 last night - an excellent film about Harriet Tubman. Known as the "Moses of her people," Harriet Tubman was enslaved, escaped, and helped others gain their freedom as a "conductor" of the Underground Railroad. Tubman also served as a scout, spy, guerrilla soldier, and nurse for the Union Army during the Civil War. Watch it! —Ed.

Available to students aged 16-18yrs, or 16-24yrs for students with an EHCP, we provide an educational setting that promotes personal development, practical work experience, functional skills

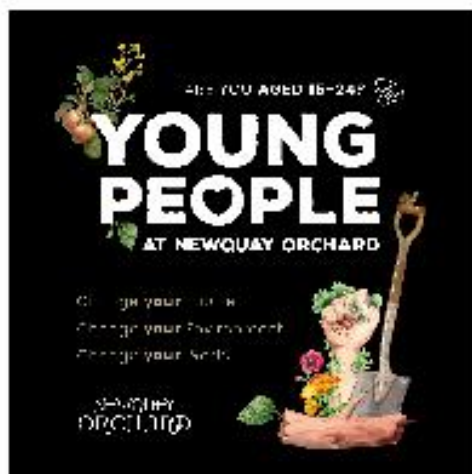
