
YEAR 5/6 OPEN EVENING 2022



GCSE HISTORY TRIP TO LONDON

Our GCSE History students enjoyed an action packed trip to London last week.

On the first day, students visited the Imperial War Museum, where they participated in a workshop on the Holocaust held in the museum's beautiful new teaching rooms.

That evening our Year 10s ate out at the 'Jungle Café' (formerly known as the Rainforest Café) before heading off to the Vaudeville Theatre to see 'SIX the Musical.' 'SIX' sees the six wives of Henry VIII take to the mic to tell their tales, remixing five hundred years of historical heartbreak into an 80-minute

celebration of 21st century girl power. Our students loved it!

The next day saw our historians visiting the Tower of London where they attended an 'Elizabeth' workshop. The Tower of London served as a royal palace, a prison, a place of execution, a royal mint, a menagerie and a public records office - it is a building steeped in stories, rumour and history.

In the evening, students visited Whitehall to discover the darkest side of London in learning about the crimes of Jack

the Ripper via a walking tour. Jack the Ripper was





















an unidentified serial killer active in the impoverished districts in and around Whitechapel in the East End of London in 1888.

The next day, students visited the Natural History Museum and the Science Museum. Along with full scale models of dinosaurs, our students particularly enjoyed the 'History of Medicine' exhibition. Exhibits included ... an iron lung which was used when people couldn't breathe unassisted - for example sufferers of Polio...A Victorian medicine cabinet... Paintings to honour the healing power of Mary...

The London History trip proved to be an excellent way to study British history and was thoroughly enjoyed by all.


