



<u>Comics Plus eComics - Cornwall Council</u> - Cornwall Library customers can now enjoy free access to Comics Plus. A huge collection of Comics and Graphic novels, something for all ages. These are available to download to a tablet or smartphone, or stream on a computer. Parents and carers can



browse our children's collection. A catalogue of comics, graphic novels and manga suitable for children so they can browse and read by themselves. Access a collection of over 19K titles, available from publishers like Disney, Dark Horse, IDW and more. Cornwall Library members will be able to browse, checkout, read online (with an internet browser) and download (on IOS or Android) using the Library Pass app.

Each library member can now borrow up to six e-books and six e-audiobooks at any one time. Please return books as soon as you have finished to allow others to read them.

Community Roots is a community growing project which involves a committed team of volunteers working to provide over 45 delicious fresh veg boxes a week to the local community, as well as offering extra produce to the Porthtowan Eco Park café and to charities who are helping to feed local people in need. Community Roots work with nature, protecting wildlife corridors, steering clear of pesticides and collecting rainwater to water crops.

The visit was very inspiring and gave us plenty of food for thought for future projects here at Richard Lander School. Thank you Community Roots for the advice and inspiration!









MESSAGE FOR PARENTS AND CARERS REGARDING ATTENDANCE AND TERM-TIME ABSENCE REQUESTS:

Our Vision for Attendance

We want our students to 'be the best they can be' by attending school regularly and punctually. Richard Lander School deems 'good' attendance to be above 96%.

Regular attendance and excellent punctuality are the foundations for academic achievement and personal development. They help students fully access their education and wider opportunities offered by the school. Attendance and punctuality are also linked to students' well-being and safety.

We are committed to ensuring that all students benefit from the opportunities available at Richard Lander School. Our expectation is that students arrive on time and attend school regularly.

Parents/carers have responsibility for ensuring that their children attend school punctually and regularly so they can benefit from a valuable education.

The school has a legal responsibility for maintaining

school registers and taking the register twice a day. The school also has a responsibility for reporting absence to the Local Authority.

The school also has a safeguarding responsibility and this links to good punctuality and attendance.

The school will communicate attendance matters to parents via text, telephone, email, and letter as well as through the school website.

Holiday absence in term time

The school will not approve term time holiday absence except in exceptional circumstances and only with the approval of an Assistant Headteacher (KS3 &4). Exceptional holiday requests should be made in writing to the school using the official term-time absence request form that can be found on our school website. All requests for absence must be on this official form.

Each case will be considered individually and the decision communicated to the parents in writing. Further information and guidance can be found in our Attendance Policy on the school website.

Road safety for teenagers

Road safety is everyone's responsibility

Teenagers are more at risk on the roads than they think.

Most teenagers don't realise that they are more likely to be killed or injured in a road collision than any other age group. Find out how to help your teenager stay safe.

Help protect your child

You should talk to your child and reinforce road safety messages to help keep them safe:

- > Stress the need to concentrate and be careful at all times.
- Warn of the dangers of distractions phones, wearing headphones or even chatting to friends while walking are big distractions.
 - Keep talking about the dangers of traffic.
- Point out people who are endangering themselves.
- Encourage your teenager to practice judging the speed and distance of approaching vehicles on busy roads and identify safe gaps in the traffic.
- Stress that your child should never lose concentration and follow others blindly into dangerous situations.

Please help us to keep students safe on the roads. As the nights draw in, road safety is an area of concern. We have been talking about this in school assemblies but please can parents/carers also have a conversation with their children about being visable on the roads (especially if riding a bike or scooter) and make sure that they understanding the highway code and how to travel safely to and from school. Road safety for teenagers



Cycling

It is a good idea to:

- Buy and encourage your teenager to wear a cycle helmet, and something fluorescent and reflective to improve their visibility.
- Encourage your child never to take lifts on the back of a friend's bike.
- Ask your child never to listen to music while they are cycling.
- Make sure your child knows that cyclists must obey all traffic signs and traffic light signals.

Bus safety

Your teenagers probably take the bus to school and back all the time, maybe even every day. In fact, they're probably so used to it, they do it without paying much attention. But not paying attention could cost them their lives. It only takes a moment's lapse of concentration to cause death or serious injury.

So your children should always expect the unexpected and never take risks going to and from the bus or crossing roads nearby. You should re-mind them:

- Just because they're not small children does not mean they should not use the Green Cross Code.
- Just because their friends are chatting doesn't mean it's safe for them.
- Most school bus related collisions happen to pupils before they get to or after they leave the bus.

Reinforce their skills

Talking to your teenager often about road safety will keep it fresh in their minds. You could ask your child where the risks are on their route, for example hidden entrances, or play games guessing what speed cars are travelling.

You could also talk about the routes your child takes regularly, and ask questions about what is on the route to see if they take notice of their environment.

Peace of mind

For your peace of mind, have routines that you can both stick to. You could try discussing the following points and finding an answer for each of them:

- What will they do if they miss a bus home?
- Do they have a mobile (fully charged), or know who a safe stranger is?
- What should your teenager do if they have to stay behind at school.
