## Munich 2024

History students have recently returned from Germany where they visited Munich, Nuremberg, Obersaltzburg and Dachau Concentration Camp. They learned about the rise and fall of Nazi Germany.

### 'Update from the Munich Trip 2024 - Day 1

Today, we arrived in Munich and eplored the city. We had a two hour walking tour and then had some free time for souvenir shopping and exploring the market in the oldest part of the city. We went for dinner at an Italian restaurant, and we're now resting ahead of a busy day in Nuremburg tomorrow. All the students have been amazing!'

### 'Munich Trip 2024 - Day 2

Nuremberg: Today we visited Courtroom 600, the site of the trials after WW2. Following this, we went to the rally grounds and Zeppelin fields for a guided tour. The students found out about the fascinating history of the grounds, which had been used long before the Nazis came to power, as a site for large rallies and festivals due to the location.

We finished the day back in Munich with some food at the Hard Rock cafe. This evening we are enjoying a History quiz in the hotel.

### 'Munich Trip 2024 - Day 3

Obersalzburg this morning. A big focus on how Hitler used propaganda during his time in power. Students were able to go into the underground tunnels. We even had some snow! In the afternoon we visited Dachau. Very thought provoking for all of our students.'

he Lander4Uganda Easter Sleepover was a great success!


It was wonderful to be able to make the most of the school outdoor spaces and lighter evenings. Hotdogs went down a storm, Lego was a great addition to the
