

### Iceland 2024

ear 10 students have just returned from Iceland where they learned about geothermal energy, tectonic plates, glacial retreat...

Here are some of Mr Williams' superb photographs of students in this stunning landscape along with the social media posts from the trip.

'Our Year 10 students had a culturally rich first day touring the streets of the capital city Reykjavik. Their day ended with an immersive experience at the Perlan Museum of Wonders. Our students explored the ice cave and had the opportunity to witness the northern lights - albeit from the perspective of a 360° cinema projection'

'Whilst battling against the elements, our students studied geomorphological processes at the Bridge Between Continents. We also explored the South Shore and developed a better understanding of how local hot springs have been harnessed to facilitate food production. Undoubtedly, the highlight of the day was





swimming in the geothermal waters of Laugardalslaug.'

Having adapted to Iceland's extreme weather, our students visited Gullfoss to observe landforms created by erosion. This was followed by an explosive display at the site of the Great Geysir during a flurry of snow and a walk through Thingvellir National Park (the site of the world's oldest parliament). An additional sojourn with the Icelandic ponies was warmly welcomed by our students.'

'It was the penultimate day in Iceland for our Year 10 students. Our students experienced two of Iceland's most impressive waterfalls, visited the ferocious Black Beach and had an opportunity to observe glacial retreat first-hand.;


On the weekend of 8th March, our Superstar RLS Gymnastics team competed at the Milano Team National Finals held at Fenton Manor, Stoke on Trent.

The event was organised by the British Judo Council and held at Carn Brea with clubs from all over


Cornwall and as far away as Tedburn St Mary competing.

### Attendance: the top facts to know & share



### The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

- In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.
- · And 36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs, also compared with 84% of regular attenders.1

### And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:

 More than half (54%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.<sup>2</sup>

### But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

 Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.3
