- For high level concerns pastoral staff may complete referrals for specific support from external agencies







Label all possessions!!!



Merit Certificates



- Every student receives a merit for 100% attendance in a week
- 5 merits for 100% attendance in any half term
- 10 merits for 100% attendance in a term
- A merit for being a top ten merit earner in any given week
- CFC's a merit for every "celebration" earned
- BFL's 10 merits for every student in the top 10 percentile rank
- 5 merits for zero behaviours in a half term
- 10 merits for zero behaviours in a term
