Introduction

Richard Lander School aims to provide all students from year 7 to 11 with meaningful opportunities to explore a wide range of future options. This policy statement aims to set out our school's arrangements for managing the access of education and training providers to students for the purpose of giving them information about their offer. This policy should be read in conjunction with the Richard Lander School Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance Policy.

Statutory requirements

Schools are required to ensure that there is an opportunity for a range of education and training providers to access students in years 8 to 13 for the purposes of informing them about approved technical education, qualifications or apprenticeships. Schools must provide a minimum of 6 encounters with technical education or training providers to all students from years 8 to 13. Schools must also have a policy statement that outlines the circumstances in which education and training providers will be given access to these Students. This is outlined in:

This policy shows how our school complies with these requirements.

Pupil entitlement

- All students in years 8 to 11 at Richard Lander School are entitled to:
- Find out about further education training, technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities as part of our careers programme, which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point

- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships, e.g. through activities and events such as options events, assemblies and taster events
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses
- Have a minimum of 6 encounters with providers

These encounters must happen for a reasonable period of time during the standard school day. The school does provide additional experiences but encounters outside of school hours do not count towards these requirements.

These encounters will include college and apprenticeship providers.

Access to Providers

Access to providers is available and promoted to allow all students to access information about other providers of further education and apprenticeships. We are committed to encouraging all students to make decisions about their future based on impartial information.

Students in year 8 and 9

All students in these year groups are offered:

2 encounters with education and training providers

All students must attend

Encounters can take place any time during year 8, and between 1 September and 28 February during year 9

Students in year 10 and 11

All students in these year groups are offered, as a minimum:

2 encounters with education and training providers

All students must attend

Encounters can take place any time during year 10, and between 1 September and 28 February during year 11

Meaningful encounters with providers

Our school is committed to providing meaningful encounters for all students.

A meaningful encounter:

- Is where the pupil can explore what it is like to learn, develop and succeed in that environment
- Involves meeting both staff and learners/trainees
- Has a clear purpose
- Is underpinned by learning outcomes that are appropriate to the needs of the pupil
- Involves a 2-way interaction between the pupil and the provider
- Includes information about the provider, such as their recruitment and selection processes, the qualifications that provider offers and the careers these could lead to
- Describes what learning or training with the provider is like

- Is followed by opportunities for the pupil to reflect on the insights, knowledge or skills gained through the encounter

Information we ask from providers

As a school we ask each provider to provide the following information for our students:

- Information about your provision and the approved qualifications or apprenticeships you offer
- Information about what careers those qualifications and apprenticeships can lead to
- What learning or training with you is like
- Answers to any questions from students

Providers will be met and supervised by a member of staff who will facilitate their visit.
